- * Nouns ending in -s,- ss,- ch,- sh,- x,- o take es in the plural.
- e.g bus buses, dress dresses, potato potatoes
- * Nouns ending in -f,-fe,drop the -f or -fe and take -ves in the plural, e.g wolf wolves
- * Nouns ending in a **consonant** + **y** drop the -y and take **-ies** in the plural. **e**,**g** baby babies







3 Countable and uncountable

- Countable nouns are nouns which can be counted and have a singular and a plural form.
 - e.g a table two tables an apple ten apples
- Uncountable nouns are nouns which cannot be counted and they have no plural.
 - e.g lemonade, cake, tea, jam, milk, soup, etc.
- We use a / an with countable nouns in the singular and some with uncountable nouns or countable nouns in the plural.
 - e.g a pineapple **But** some lemonade, some biscuits
- we use words such as bottle, can, jar, etc. with uncountable nouns when we want to take about quantity.
 - e.g a bottle of lemonade, two cans of cola, four jars of jam, etc.
