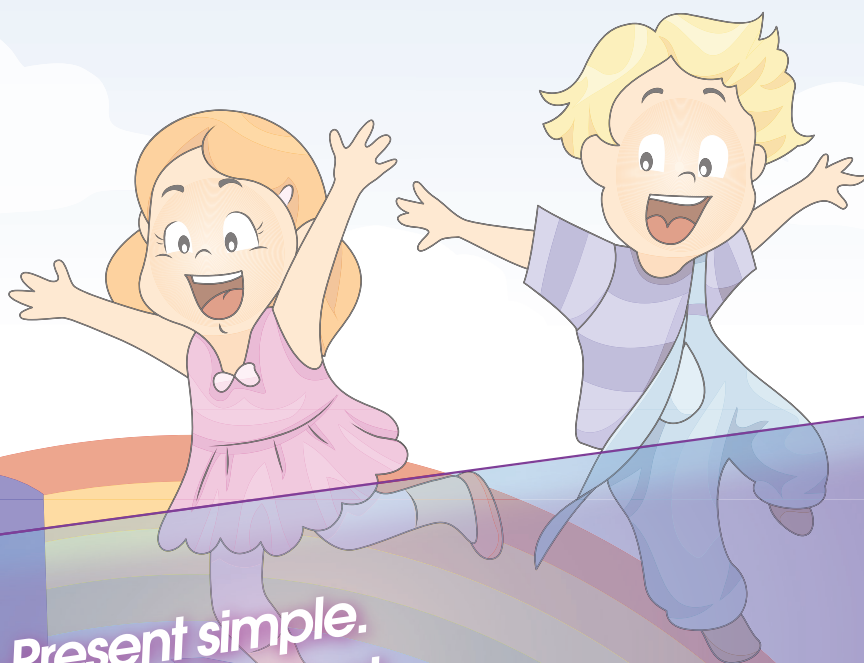

| Affirmative | I, you, we and they walk | He, she and it walks |
| Negative | I, you, we, and they don't walk | He, she, it doesn't walk |
| Interrogative | Do I, you, we they + v- infinitive? | Does he, she ,it? |

use

1-To talk about repeated actions.

He **goes** to work by car.

**2-To talk about habits , routines.**

They usually **read** in the library.

**3-Time tables.**

The plane from London **arrives** at 2 :00 P.M.

**4-Telling stories.**

The king **asks** her to marry him.

**5-Describing people :**

She **has** long hair.

**6-Facts or laws of nature.**

The sun **rises** in the east.

8-Permanent states.

Spelling Notes: (3 rd person singular only)

-Verbs ending in **ss** , **- sh** , **ch** – **x** or – **o** take – **es**.

Watch watches**es**.

Wash wash**es**.

Go go**es**.

-Verbs ending in a consonant + **Y** , drop the – **y** and add – **ies**.

Study → studi**es**.

Tidy → tid**ies**.

Adverb of frequency

| always | 100% |
| usually | 80% |
| often | 60% |
| sometimes | 30% |
| rarely/seldom | 10% |
| never | 0% |

***Before the main verb :**

e. g : my mother usually goes shopping on Saturdays

***After v. to be.**

e. g : A del **is always** clever at reading novels.

***Rarely, seldom and never have a negative meaning without not.**

e.g : I never **play** in the street.

Have, has + past participle

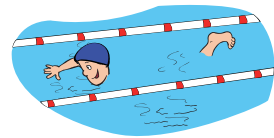
form

| | | |
|----------------------|---|--|
| Affirmative | I, you, we and they have done | He, she and it has done |
| Negative | I, you, we, and they haven't done | He, she, it hasn't done |
| Interrogative | Have I , you , we they done ? | has he , she , it done ? |

use

1-For actions which happened at an unstated time in the past.

He **has learned** how to swim (we don't know when)



2- For actions which here recently finished , but we can see the result in the present.

They **have finished** their school day.



3-For experiences.

He **has tried** climbing the mountains.



4-With expressions today, this morning / afternoon.

John has received two letters this morning.



5-For actions which started in the past and still continue in the present. We should use for or since.

Miss Randa **has been** a teacher for twelve.

Miss Randa **has been** a teacher since 2005.



Note

For = period of time

Since = the beginning of the time.
